## Java support



After the end of the free support of the Java platform by Oracle, much uncertainty has arisen as to whether and how Java can continue to be used.

In this context, the OpenJDK should first be mentioned. Since version 7, OpenJDK is the free, open source and official reference implementation of the Java platform, Standard Edition, Java SE for short. All major vendors of Java runtime environments (JRE  $\rightarrow$  Java Runtime Environment) or Java development kits (JDK  $\rightarrow$  Java Development Kit) use OpenJDK as the basis for their implementations and distributions. Differences are, for example, that certain optimizations have been made or parts have been replaced or that different license conditions apply.

Also the JDK of Oracle (*Oracle JDK*) is based on the source code of *OpenJDK*. However, in addition, it contains components that are not available as *open source* (*closed source* components). For the distributions, a commercial license is required since 2019 for use in enterprises.

Due to the free availability of *Java SE* via *OpenJDK*, other vendors can make their Java distributions (JREs and JDKs) available in the usual way and with unchanged license conditions.

For the use of Business-Logics software, the *Oracle JDK* is not necessary. The following list provides an overview of common Java implementations<sup>1</sup> that are compatible with Business-Logics products:
